8th Grade Rep – Kaylin Kelly:


- Future Warrior Night was Dec. 3rd. Made it feel like high school was right around the corner.

- CVHS Presentation: Provided important information to DAC. Focus of CVHS is on credit recovery, not necessary behavior/discipline.
- National Merit Finalists were recognized last month (top 1% scoring on PSAT).

Progress Monitoring of Single School Plan - Mr. Klinger:

- California Dashboard Data is now live.
- Mr. Klinger reviewed our Dashboard Results including English and Math progress. Both subjects improved with the most gain in Math. Both subjects overall are above standard.
- Discipline (Suspension) and Attendance data was reviewed. LCMS saw improvements in Suspension data (reduction of overall suspensions, but our Chronic Absenteeism Rate declined.
- School (Counselors) are putting a focus on improving attendance this year. EL Progress also saw a large decline. Only 50% of EL students made progress compared to 70% the year before. EL Progress is still better than other MS, but the school is looking at how to regain the past growth. SSC.
- Discussed student motivation as well as how to decrease test anxiety for future CAASPP assessments.
