Progress Monitoring of Single School Plan - Mr. Klinger:

- CommonLit way to assess students' reading comprehension.
 - Discussed pre-assessment in September.
 - 6th Grade 36% not meeting standards (100% of EL students are not proficient in English).
- Went over Math common assessments data.
 - o 6th, 7th and 8th grade are giving common assessments across all departments.
 - Went over results from Ch. 1 and Ch. 2 tests (averages). Lowest group is the Math 8 CP.
 - EL kids, kids with IEPs and low income kids are struggling.
 - 8th graders have low numbers.
- Had Q1 grade analysis out of 4400 grades 66.8% of kids had A's. (3005). 11% of kids had B's.

- Counseling is adding a survey to identify why kids are struggling.
- Most Ds and Fs are in Science and Social Studies.
- Discussion with the council about motivating students to do better academically.
