- A. District Advisory Committee (DAC) Report
- Student reporters at high schools are now reporting at school board meetings. They are giving insights on what goes on at high schools.
- Conejo Elementary School will start the first Dual Language Immersion program for kindergarten students in August 2022. It's a huge undertaking for the school and the staff. Parents can request a school choice for Dual Language Program.
- School Choice is also available for teachers so they can choose the school that works best for their families.
- SEL (Social Emotional Learning) Curriculum has been added to the LCAP and at schools.
- 60 mins per week (TK-8), 45 mins per week (9-12)
- Stanford Harmony Program used in elementary schools.
- Middle schools will work on 4 different units (Mindset & Goals, Bullying & Harassment, Thoughts, Emotions & Decisions, Managing Relationships & Social Conflict).
- Covid quarantine has been reduced to 7 days with a negative test on day 5 after the student has been exposed.
- 2 new Advisory Council members have been added to DAC and School Sites LGTBQ + and African American (AADAC) to provide support to the communities.
- The laws of the Brown and Greene Act need to be changed: At the beginning of Covid, the state of California allowed all District meetings to be held electronically, this ended at the end of September 2021. We can get an extension to continue doing electronically held meetings for 30 days. We looked into that for our school, and it looks like the School Site council falls under the Greene Act and is excluded from that but waiting to hear back from DAC.
