 - Student is found eligible
 - Individualized Education Plan (IEP) is developed
 - Student will have a case manager
 - Goals will be proposed
 - Accommodations will be proposed
 - o The Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) will be proposed
 - Data and team discussions will help to develop the IEP
 - Sent parent/guardian for approval
 - Cannot be implemented until agreed upon
- 3. Continuum of Services
 - Least Restrive Environment
 - Regular Classroom with accommodations/modification
 - Regular classroom with pull-out services
 - Separate classroom (all students have IEPs)
 - Home education options
 - Most restrictive environments
- 4. Related Services
 - Related services are services required to assist a child with a disability to meet their IEP goals and make educational progress.
 - They are determined by the needs, goals, and supports identified in an IEP.
 - They are documented in the IEP.
