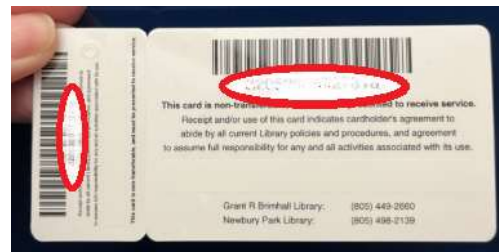
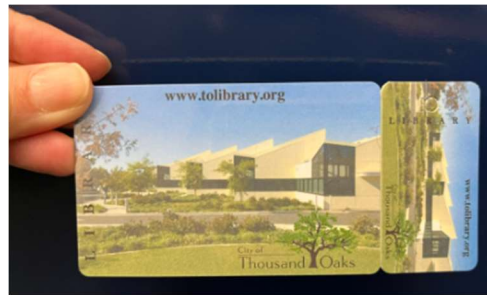


Setting Up your account on Fiero Code



Fiero Code is a self-guided online software program that teaches you how to code through hundreds of coding tutorials and real-world projects. Get started with Fiero Code by **signing up** with your library card and creating your own username and password.

Home – Main page to see all the updates and progress and projects

Pathways – These are recommended tutorials for long-term skills such as if you have interest in becoming a Web Developer, Robotics or Game Developer.

Courses – You can see all the available tutorials by Beginner, Intermediate or Advanced, and also for various topics like Games, Robotics or Maker. Chose the courses you want to learn about.

Challenges – After taking some courses, you may want to complete a Challenge. These are specific tasks that ask you to use your knowledge and learning to create something specific.

Create – These are blank pages – places you can code on your own in the language you want to code.

Contest – Every few months there is a new contest with possible prizes for those who submit their entries, they have a chance to win. These are seasonal challenges that encourage everyone to participate.

Gear – As you complete courses or challenges, you will earn gear to customize your robot avatar.

If you are new to Fiero Code or Coding – you may wish to start with **Courses** as a way to learn.

As you become more knowledgeable – try **Challenges** and **Contests**, or try to just use **Create** to work on projects that you are inspired to do.

As you progress, you may wish to choose a **Pathways** to help you fulfill a long-term goal in learning.

We recommend you setup some time to regularly access Fiero Code so you can practice and learn at your own pace.
