- **A.** Presentation: Practical Resources for Parents, Alma Molina, DELAC Vice-President CVUSD has many resources for parents.
 - 1. Tech Support technology wants to ensure you have a device that is working properly.

- **B.** Presentation: Reopen & Redesign/Small Cohort/Waiver Process Update, Dr. Lisa Miller, Assistant Superintendent Student Services

4-tier Color-Coded Monitoring System:

o Yellow: minimal spread; full opening

o Orange: moderateo Red: substantial

o Purple: highest level of spread; schools cannot reopen

• State sets/determines the color

Q: News said we switched to red, is that true?

A: All data showed that we were getting better but if we move to Red the county needs to stay there for 14 days before we can make movement.

Small Group and Cohorts:

- No more than 16 students in a room
- Can't intermingle with others by classroom, playground, etc.
- This does not replace the remote class schedule. It would be targeted support on campus

Q: Can parents keep students at home until they are ready/comfortable to send them back?

A: We will continue to offer a full Remote Schedule all school year. Not obligated to join the small groups and cohorts

Waiver:

This is only for TK-6th grade only. CVUSD School Board recommended that the school district apply.

Q: How long will it take or what is holding back?

- **C.** Presentation: English Learner Proficiency Assessment for California, (ELPAC), Dr. Deborah Martinez, Coordinator of English Learner Services
 - a. ELPAC is the assessment used to assess students that have a second language.
 - b. Now we are currently doing the Initial ELPAC to those that the Home Language Survey indicates another language and enrolled for the first time in California.
 - c. Summative assessment is given in March and this is the annual assessment, but for the 2019-2020 school year all state assessments were cancelled.
 - d. We are doing Initial 1:1 Assessment to approximately 280 students
 - e. Students that are close to reclassifying are candidates to take the Summative assessment now.
 - f. Remote option for a few students
 - g. This is a computer based assessment
 - h. Many resources for students to study the modality of the test so they are more comfortable when taking the assessment. All links will be emailed to DELAC representatives.
