- ESY runs from June 21 through July 21

- Only students with IEPs are eligible to participate in ESY. ESY is for students with an IEP that will regress in skills without recoupment comparable to their peers and thus require an extension to their school year (20 days).

- For TK-5 Foster Youth and those experiencing unstable housing (McKinney-Vento)
- August 14-18 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.
- Focus on ELA, Math and Social Emotional Learning (SEL) as well as engaging students in a way that excites them to return to school the next week
- Transportation provided
- Taught by CVUSD teachers with the support of bilingual and special education paraeducators
