AccessArts

AccessArts has a vision to provide <u>high-quality sequential access to arts education</u> to all elementary school-aged youth of Ventura County (60,000 students).

Arts education plays a vital role in student achievement, equitable education outcomes and community success.

In FY2021-22, TOArts provided over \$60,000 in AccessArts grants.





Funding from AccessArts transformed a Conejo Valley **elementary school computer lab into a dance studio** for regular dance classes for all its 300 students to enjoy.

Helped create a strategic arts plan for CVUSD.


Provided arts integration training to local elementary school teachers to use the arts to teach other subjects.

A poetic adaptation of Yuyi Morales' story tells of resilience, hope and the courage it takes to find one's voice during an immigrant's journey. Grade Levels: K - 4

THE NUTCRACKER



December 1 - January 15

Pacific Festival Ballet performs a narrated show with excerpts of *The Nutcracker* and provides extension activities about ballet and storytelling in performing arts.

Grade Levels: All levels



BLACK NORTH THE MUSICAL



January 15 - February 28

NORTH, the musical follows the journey of a teenage boy. Lawrence and his young mother. Minnie, as they escape and travel North through the Underground Railroad, to seek their freedom.

Grade Levels: 4+









 - Fred Kavli Theatre (1800 seats)
 - Janet and Ray Scherr Forum Theatre (394 seats)
- TOArts is the fundraising and presenting partner for BAPAC
- The city provides operational and leadership support to TOArts through key staff
