January 27, 2004 <u>MINUTES</u>

The Conejo Valley Unified School District Board of Education met in Regular Session on January 27, 2004, at the District Office Board Room, 1400 East Janss Road, Thousand Oaks, California.

CALL TO ORDER

Present were Board members Dorothy L. Beaubien, Mary Jo Del Campo, Dolores Didio, Patricia H. Phelps, and Timothy G. Stephens. Richard Simpson, Assistant Superintendent, Instructional Services sat in for Dr. Robert Fraisse, Superintendent, who was attending a State-level superintendents' symposium. Jody Dunlap, Assistant Superintendent, Personnel Services, Dr. Jeffrey Baarstad, Assistant Superintendent, Business Services, Chuck Eklund, Director, Secondary Education, Linda Faverty, Director, Elementary Education, and Martha Mutz, Director, Curriculum/Media Services, were also present.

ROLL CALL

The Closed Session meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m. by Dorothy Beaubien, President. The Board discussed appointment/employment of: Certificated: Teachers; Classified: Child Care Leaders, Child Nutrition Assistant, Paraprofessionals/Special Ed, Paraprofessionals/Bilingual Spanish, Telephone Operator/Receptionist, Substitutes. Exempt: Specialists, Campus Supervisors, Student Helpers, Athletic Coaches, Proctor. The Closed Session ended at 6:10 p.m.

CLOSED SESSION

President Beaubien called the meeting to order at 6:12 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. President Beaubien read announcements that reviewed instructions regarding smoking, cell phones, Speaker's Cards, Public Statement Cards, and where the public could find agendas and Board procedure information.

Chuck Eklund provided information regarding the Girl Scout Golden Awards, and the Boy Scout Eagle Awards. The various principals introduced the students who provided service at their schools to earn the awards: Paul Gibbs, Newbury Park High School, built cubbies for the primary grade students at Banyan Elementary School; Trevor Snyder, Thousand Oaks High School, cleaned and repaired all the miniblinds and washed windows at Ladera Elementary School; Jonathan Evans, Newbury Park High School, built and installed parking lot benches at Madroña Elementary School; Ryan Nugent, Newbury Park High School, built and installed three benches for students at Manzanita Elementary School; Natalie Faltin and Christine Harrison, Newbury Park High School, raised money to purchase a large storage shed for the band equipment,

then cleaned and reorganized the band room and storage unit; Nicholas Olson, Westlake High School, re-landscaped and planted an area on the school's campus including sprinklers and a wrought iron fence; Ben Small, Westlake High School, cleaned up and installed a retaining wall on the embankment above the softball field; Kevin Fudge, Thousand Oaks High School, identified and coded all the library books at Aspen Elementary School.

Dr. Simpson: 1) began by offering congratulations to the Boys & Girls Club for their successful ribbon cutting and grand opening ceremony at the new club at Los Cerritos Middle School last Wednesday. The staff at Los Cerritos is very excited about the opportunity to begin using the Club facilities for school programs and activities during the school day. 2) announced that Dr. Linda Calvin was selected by the California Association for the Gifted as the "Administrator of the Year" for the central coast region. 3) stated that in reference to the District's Strategic Plan, one of the goals of the Instructional Improvement Committee has been to work on strategies and programs for improving access to student performance data. Through discussion with Houghton Mifflin, who recently purchased Edusoft, our District has been selected to partner in developing and piloting their additions to the Edusoft program. This will give our staff and teachers access to additional, valuable student performance data, particularly in the area of English Language Arts, 1-2 years before the system will be available to other districts

SUPT. REMARKS

Terry McCallum, President, Conejo Schools Foundation, thanked the staff and community for their wonderful responses to the Foundation's *First 100 Days* drive, which is still in progress. Mr. McCallum mentioned that the Foundation would soon have a preliminary naming opportunity list. All the Board members applauded the opening of the Boys & Girls Club at Los Cerritos Middle School, and encouraged anyone who has any questions about the Club to visit and witness all the programs available to the students at Los Cerritos.
