# **January 23, 2007 MINUTES**

Max Beaman, Director, Secondary Education, Janet Cosaro, Director, Curriculum, and Linda Peralta, Director, Elementary Education, were also in attendance.

#### **Comments from the Superintendent**

Superintendent Contini 1). Chamber's Teacher of the Month for January. Mr. Contini also thanked the TO/WLV Regional Chamber of Commerce and the many local businesses for this wonderful program that honors our teachers.
