CALL TO ORDER – CLOSED SESSION

Prior to the beginning of Closed Session, Board member Mike Dunn informed Superintendent Baarstad that he might have a conflict of interest preventing him from participating in discussions or actions related to the sale of the District's Kelley Road property. Mr. Dunn is a neighbor of one of the investors/owners of Daylight Investors, the company proposing to purchase the Kelley Road property. Pending further information from Mr. Dunn and legal analysis from District legal counsel, Dr. Baarstad recommended Mr. Dunn recuse himself from the Closed Session discussion of Kelley Road.

Mrs. Phelps 1) clarified information for the public and others who have questioned why there have not been meetings to discuss the bond measure. 2) attended the DAC meeting on September 9 and was disappointed for the DAC representatives who felt as if they were being threatened by comments made by a public speaker who said that a fine and/or imprisonment could be enforced if the Brown Act rules were not followed. Mrs. Phelps expressed her respect for what DAC has meant to the district over the years, and hopes that the exchange of information at future meetings will not be stymied by threats from a community member. 3) was pleased that when she attended the Conejo Coalition for Youth and Families, Kathleen Murvin was recognized and congratulated for receiving the Golden Bell award. 4) mentioned The Parent Project program sponsored by the Thousand Oaks Police Department and Conejo Recreation & Park District regarding many issues with teenage children.
