The Conejo Valley Unified School District Board of Education met in Regular Session on October 12, 2004, at the District Office Board Room, 1400 East Janss Road, Thousand Oaks, California.

ROLL CALL

Chuck Eklund, Director, Secondary Education, Martha Mutz, Director, Curriculum, Dr. Michael Vollmert, Director, Assessment & Technology were also present.

CLOSED SESSION

The Closed Session meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Dorothy Beaubien, President.
