CONEJO VALLEY UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION REGULAR MEETING

October 14, 2003 <u>MINUTES</u> (Adopted)

The Conejo Valley Unified School District Board of Education met in Regular Session CALL TO on October 14, 2003, at the District Office Board Room, 1400 East Janss Road, ORDER Thousand Oaks, California.

Present were Board members Dorothy L. Beaubien, Mary Jo Del Campo, Dolores Didio, Patricia H. Phelps, and Timothy G. Stephens. Also present were Robert Fraisse, Superintendent, Richard Simpson, Assistant Superintendent, Instructional Services and Jody Dunlap, Assistant Superintendent, Personnel Services. Chuck Eklund, Director, Secondary Education, Linda Faverty, Director, Elementary Education, and Martha Mutz, Director, Curriculum, were also in attendance.

The Closed Session meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by Dolores Didio, President. The Board discussed appointment/employment of: Certificated: Teachers; Classified: Substitutes; Exempt: Campus Supervisors, Student Helper, Athletic Coaches. The Closed Session ended at 6:04 p.m.

President Didio called the meeting to order at 6:06 p.m., led the Pledge of Allegiance, and read announcements for the Board meeting that reviewed instructions regarding smoking, cell phones, Speaker's Cards, Public Statement Cards, and where the public can find agendas and Board procedure information. PLEDGE AND ANNOUNCE-MENTS

Mrs. Beaubien moved to <u>approve the agenda</u>, seconded by Dr. Stephens. Motion **APPROVE** AGENDA

The principals from each of the high schools presented the National Merit Semi-Finalists from their respective schools: Newbury Park High School: Matthew S. Lee, Jennifer A. Lorden; Thousand Oaks High School: William C. Wu; Westlake High School: Melody R. Hsiou, Sophie B. Sun, Sujing Qiu. **NATIONAL MERIT SEMI-FINAL**.

Heather Sand, student Board member representing Thousand Oaks High School, sat with the Board. Heather, along with Matthew Lee, Newbury Park High School, Kathleen Sullivan, Westlake High School, and Vanessa Hernandez, Conejo Valley High School, discussed school activities such as school-to-career, college workshops, athletic events, fund raisers, band tournaments, homecoming activities, rallies, WASC visit, Red Ribbon Week activities, Halloween theme contests, talent show, student tutoring programs, principal's coffees, senior activities, college counseling.

Dianne McKay, District Advisory Council Chair, discussed topics from the September **DISTRICT** meeting including campus supervision, orientation for new members, and thanked the Board for the entire DAC opportunity which most districts do not offer.

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Justine Fischer, Conejo Council PTA Chair, provided information regarding the parent information night on October 29 (Risk Factors for Teens), and discussed Dr. Fraisse speaking at the next meeting about the Conejo Schools Foundation, and the 12th District workshop regarding bylaws, finance and leadership skills.

Jack Tucker, Bond District Advisory Chair, updated the Board on the bond facilities improvements and Boys & Girls Club.

Dr. Fraisse 1) welcomed Dr. Baarstad to the dais for his first time since he began his position as Assistant Superintendent Business Services; 2) talked about the PACE autodial program that 19 of our schools are using to inform students' families of special events or emergency situations at the schools. Various businesses are funding the cost of the program, and therefore the sponsorship is mentioned in the message. The staff feels that this is a small exchange for the tremendous service provided to our students and parents; 3) thanked Verizon for the \$75,000 grant to Adult Ed; 4) commended Regena Ward and her staff for coming through an incredibly difficult budget year with a clean audit report; 5) talked about the "bus drill" during his visited to Manzanita Elementary and their tremendous new playground; 6) asked for patience and assistance in trying to help schedule the refurbishing of the high school tracks and scheduling of programs such as T.O. Flyers at Thousand Oaks High School.

Ben Navarro, Paul Nicholson, Henry Wolf, and Robert H. McCarter discussed their **PUBLIC** concerns about accessibility of the Thousand Oaks High School track during their season in the spring when the stadium reconstruction is underway. Dianne McKay remarked with the \$3.1 million from the City of Thousand Oaks to renovate the three high school stadiums, the community and school district need to work together to ensure that the renovation project is not compromised. However, Mrs. McKay offered to work with the District to find a way to help Flyers program through the construction period. There were 15 public statements cards stating concerns about the accessibility of the tract to the Flyers.

Dr. Stephens discussed his visit to the newly renovated schools, such as Meadows BOARD Elementary. BOARD REMARKS

Mrs. Phelps mentioned the new name of the joint powers agency formerly known as Conejo Substance Abuse Prevention Authority (CSAPA), now the Conejo Coalition of Youth and Families. Mrs. Phelps will be the Board representation to that organization.

Mrs. Del Campo commented on the success of the Boys & Girls Club fundraiser at the Sherwood Country Club.

Mrs. Beaubien moved to <u>approve Personnel Assignment Orders Certificated #6628 -</u> **PAO'S** <u>#6638, Classified #C-1675 - #C-1725, and Exempt #E-4576 - #E-4734</u>, seconded by Dr. Stephens. Motion carried 5-0. Student vote: abstain. Mrs. Del Campo moved to <u>approve to amend Policy 433 Intradistrict Attendance</u> **POLICY** <u>School Choice (2nd Reading)</u> as proposed, seconded by Mrs. Phelps. Motion carried 5- **AMEND.** 0. A.R. #1 filed. Student vote: aye.

Mrs. Phelps moved to <u>adopt the Red Ribbon Week Proclamation</u>, seconded by Mrs. **RED RIBBON** Beaubien. Motion carried 5-0. Student vote: aye. **WEEK PRO.**

Dr. Stephens moved to <u>approve the Youth Outreach Program</u>, seconded by Mrs. Phelps. **YOUTH** Dr. Stephens pointed out that this was another example of agency partnership for the betterment of the community. Mrs. Phelps and Mrs. Didio requested a report on the impact of the program over the past several years. Motion carried 5-0. Student vote: aye.

Mrs. Del Campo moved to <u>authorize staff to pursue a professional polling of the</u> <u>community with regard to their support of a parcel tax in the range of \$25 to \$35 per</u> <u>year for a term of 3-4 years</u>, seconded by Mrs. Beaubien. Dr. Fraisse offered a presentation regarding the need for a parcel tax to help the District through the State budget crisis. Dr. Baarstad explained the polling service process. Motion carried 5-0. Student vote: aye.

Mrs. Beaubien moved to approve the Consent Agenda, seconded by Mrs. Phelps. Dr. CONSENT Stephens discussed the value of field trips to Sacramento, and asked if trips were AGENDA always planned during weekends and for more than one night. Mrs. Faverty stated that liability is a factor, and that while the schools have been offered more than one night, they seem to prefer overnight trips. Motion carried 5-0. Student vote: abstain.
