# 5. INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS - GENERAL

### A. Instructional Services – Presentation: Booster Clubs

President Gill announced that there was one (1) public comment request submitted, and that speaker received three (3) minutes to speak. Dr. McLaughlin responded to the public comment and asked Dr. Hayek to further research the issues related to high temperatures inside the high school gyms and access to AED units.

Mr. Loo and Mr. Mercer presented information on the district's booster clubs and parent organizations, including a brief overview of their roles and relationship with CVUSD, the orientation and reauthorization processes, communication and collaboration between the district and booster clubs/parent organizations, and feedback on potential improvements. Mr. Loo, Mr. Mercer, Mr. Branham, and Mr. Godfrey responded to questions from Board members regarding communication to parents/guardians on optional donations, current challenges related to booster clubs, financial support for boosters and applicable rules, promotion of fundraising opportunities, and the importance of separating coaches from booster club donation information.

B. Student Services – Presentation: Special Education Program Adjustment Proposals

Dr. McLaughlin provided background on the process followed to agendize this topic for public discussion. President Gill announced that there were eleven (11) public comment requests submitted, and each speaker received three (3) minutes to speak. Dr. Egans introduced Dr. Roderick, Dr. Sellers, and Ms. Thomas, who presented information on the Special Education

Program adjustment proposals for Be Me Preschool, elementary specialized programs, and Conejo Oaks Academy's post-secondary program. The presentation included the following proposed program adjustments, along with the purpose of each adjustment and program considerations:

- Be Me preschool program relocation to Sycamore Canyon School and Weathersfield Elementary School (3 classes on each campus)
  District staff responded to questions from Board members regarding the lack of inclusion opportunities between Wonder and Be Me preschool students, inclusion opportunities at the current and proposed sites, inclusion training for Preschool/TK teachers and staff, security, safety, and traffic concerns at the proposed relocation sites, appropriate playground upgrades, teacher input on the proposed adjustments, and start and dismissal times for affected students.
- Elementary specialized programs would expand from 5 to 9 elementary sites, with 2 classes from Maple Elementary relocating to Banyan Elementary, and the creation of a therapeutic learning center at Westlake Hills Elementary School
  District staff responded to questions from Board members regarding how Banyan and Westlake Hills were selected as recipient sites, advantages of keeping programs together, clarification on how moving students creates more inclusion opportunities, concern regarding decreasing Maple's enrollment count, opportunities for teacher input, and inclusion training for teachers and staff.
- Conejo Oaks Academy post-secondary program relocation to Thousand Oaks High School
   District staff responded to questions from Board members regarding the increased opportunities for trips to the community and inclusion and relationship building with adults, clarification on expanded leadership opportunities, benefits of increased inclusion opportunities for neurotypical peers, current goals/objectives for the Conejo
  - Oaks Academy program and success in meeting those goals/objectives, location/structure of post-secondary programs in neighboring districts, and feedback from parents and teachers.

Dr. McLaughlin requested that the Board provide direction to staff on their decision to move forward with each proposal. *The Board reached consensus to move forward with the proposals for the preschool and elementary specialized programs. The Board reached consensus to table the proposal for Conejo Oaks Academy post-secondary program.* District staff will move forward with working with principals and teachers on the proposed program adjustments and soliciting stakeholder feedback.

# C. Instructional Services – Approval of New Middle School Core Literature Title – When Stars are Scattered

Mr. Loo provided information on the upcoming core literature information webinar and responded to questions from Board members regarding clarification on which titles were included in the webinar and whether there were any questions posed from attendees.

# D. Instructional Services – Approval of New High School Core Literature Titles – Interpreter of Maladies, Purple Hibiscus, World of Wonders

There was no Board discussion on this agenda item. Questions related to this agenda item were discussed by the Board during related Agenda Item 5C.

### E. Business Services – Amendments to the Facility Use Rules and Regulations

Dr. Hayek provided background on the review process for Facility Use rules and regulations and responded to questions from Board members regarding verbiage changes related to Facilitron and the reservation approval process, an added section on pool use, rules regarding signs placed on district property, regulation enforcement by custodial or district staff, and communication to user groups related to rule violations.

# F. Business Services – 2023-2024 District Fee Review: Facility Use Fees

President Gill announced that there was one (1) public comment request submitted, and that speaker received three (3) minutes to speak. Dr. McLaughlin stated that the presentation by Dr. Hayek would show an amended fee schedule that should address the public speaker's concerns. Dr. Hayek then provided a brief overview to the facility use program, including the calculation of direct costs, cost analysis, cost comparison with neighboring districts, rules and regulations, California legislation framework for public facility management, facilities by use for prior and current years, a list of top 10 user groups, and prior Board discussion on the fee schedule. Dr. Hayek responded to questions from Board members regarding the fee percentage increase for the 2023-2024 school year for affected user groups, fee comparison for custodial services and for specific user groups, impact of the proposed fee increase on user groups, and clarification on the fees for field, restroom, and parking lot use. Following Board discussion, the Board reached consensus for staff to bring forward the proposed fee schedule for a one-year commitment with the updated rules and regulations.

 During the discussion on Agenda Item 5F, Trustee Goldberg moved to extend the meeting to no later than 11:30 p.m., seconded by Trustee Sylvester. Motion carried: 4-0. Trustee Basile was not present during this vote.

# G. Business Services – 2023-2024 District Child Nutrition Review: School Lunch Meal and Ala Carte Pricing

Dr. Hayek provided background on the fee review process, cost increases, the proposed increase in pricing for ala cart options, and working toward the potential option of accepting debit and credit cards as forms of payment. There was no Board discussion on this agenda item.

# H. Human Resources – Approval of Amendments to Board Policy 4111, 4211, 4311 – Recruitment and Selection

Mrs. Valentine provided background on the amendments based on Gamut updates and changes in Labor Code. There was no Board discussion on this agenda item.

I. Board of Education – Approval of Amendments to Board Bylaw 9100 – Organization Dr. McLaughlin provided background on the amendments based on Gamut updates. There was no Board discussion on this agenda item.
