Course Description:

This is the introductory course in the Emergency Response Pathway. Course content includes classroom instruction, hands on training, and community experience. This course is designed to give students an understanding of operations for a variety of emergency service agencies (Fire, Police, Marine Rescue, and EMS), as well as employment opportunities and skills necessary for careers in the area of Emergency Services. Students must pass a background check in order to intern with local law enforcement, Fire, Ocean Rescue, or EMS agencies.
