Elementary: CVUSD Summer Learning Programs

Summer Learning Camp

- July 5th-July 28th; 8:30 AM 12 PM
- Students Grades K-4 offered enrollment based on academic performance and site recommendations
- High school interns
- Walnut Elementary: 279 students
- Glenwood Elementary: 309 students

Expanded Learning Program (ELOP)

- After Summer Learning Camp 80 students
- All Day Camp Option (8:30-5:30) 77 students
- Coordinated by Star Education at both school sites
- Lunch and snack served to students
- Rotation of three activities Outdoor Activities, Social Emotional Learning, Educational Technology


Students Served:

• HS Credit recovery - students with a D or F from 2022-23 (95%)

Acceleration Opportunities

Student enrollment offered to Students with Disabilities, English Learners, and AVID students

Enrollment: 292 students

Student Participation and Pass Rates

- Accelerated Health and World History for AVID students - 85 students (99% pass)
- Accelerated Health and PE for students with an IEP 74 students (94% pass rate)
- Accelerated PE, Health, or World History for English Learners 108 (94% pass)



Extended School Year (ESY)

ESY services are special education and related services that are provided to students as determined in their individualized education plans (IEPs). Services are intended to help maintain skills and routines that students have learned during the regular school year.

English Learner Programs

• Instructional Focus

- Ensured that English Learners continued to receive instruction during the summer to prevent learning loss and increase their literacy skills
- Provided the opportunity to English Learners to accelerate their learning for high school credit through different course offerings

Courses Offered

- English Language Development
- English Language Arts and Math Intervention
- Health (Accelerated Class)
- Physical Education (Accelerated Class)
- World History (Accelerated Class)
- Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM)





Early Back Intervention

- August 14-18
- Students in grades K-5 were explicitly invited based on unique needs to participate in the five-day program
- Three classes each at Acacia, Conejo, and Walnut
 - Transportation provided to those in need
- Welcomed students back, revisited essential skills in ELA and math, and built executive functioning and socialemotional learning skills while keeping it fun!
- All 75 students left with backpacks filled with school supplies to start the school year, thanks to community partner donations
