- Students may earn the seal on a transcript, diploma, or Certificate of Completion.

- 1. Be engaged in academic work in a productive way;
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of democratic principles, concepts, and processes
- 3. Civic engagement project(s)
- 4. Demonstrate civic knowledge, skills, and dispositions through self-reflection
- 5. Exhibit character traits that reflect civic-mindedness and a commitment to positively impact the classroom, school, community, and/or society.
