## What is A-G?

Minimum requirements to be eligible to apply for a California State University (CSU) or a University of California (UC)

One way to be "college ready"



# Our Goal





The California State University Increase the number of high school students, particularly targeted groups, who graduate from high school with A-G eligibility requirements completed for admissions to CSU and UC.

Targeted groups include: English Learners, Socio-economic Disadvantaged, Students with Disabilities, Students with Unstable Housing (McKinney Vento)

# College & Career Readiness Counselors

- Educate families and students:
  - A-G eligibility requirements
  - Access to courses
  - Academic progress monitoring
  - Other useful information
- Collect and analyze grade distribution and A-G eligibility
- Meet with students to track progress
- Facilitate and monitor tutoring and credit recovery programs
- Communicate with teachers & other counselors at their site regarding student progress and needs

A-G Counselor calls each student to a meeting to encourage attendance at tutoring centers, explain A-G benefits, graduation requirements, and motivate students to achieve A-G eligibility.




