Purpose

Provide information on the Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P) requirements, stakeholder engagement and current TK-6 models.

The ELO-P program plan needs to be approved by the governing board in a public meeting before June 30, 2022.



Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P)

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P) provides funding for enrichment programs for transitional kindergarten through sixth grade.

"Expanded learning" means before school, after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.



ELO-P Requirements

Hours of Program - No less than 9 hours of program, includes school day

Days of Program - All school days + 30 intersession days

Components of the Day - Can be provided before and/or after school, or during intersession days

Locations of Program - Can be provided on 1 or multiple school sites within a school district

Funding Guidelines for 2021-22 & 2022-23

- CVUSD total allocation \$1,477,596
- Funding based on average daily attendance and unduplicated pupil percentage
- Offer to at least all unduplicated students (EL, Foster, & SED) Grades TK-6
- Serve at least 50% of unduplicated students Grades TK-6 in the 2021-22 year



Stakeholder Engagement

- Presentation and feedback gathered at elementary and middle school School Site Councils and Faculty meetings
- ELO-P Committee Meetings held in February and March. Committee composed of District and site administration, teachers, and support staff.
- Discussion with labor partners
- Title I Parent Family Engagement Task Force input
