Summative ELPAC Overview

- All students designated as English Learners in CALPADS
- We currently have 1,905 English Learners that need to administered the Summative ELPAC
- Computer-based
- Four domains assessed: Listening, Speaking Reading and Writing
- Grades K-2: 1:1 Entire ELPAC Assessment
- Grades 3-12: Only the Speaking is administered in a 1:1 setting. The rest of the ELPAC test will most likely be administered in a group setting.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

As an English learner, your child will take the Summative English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) this spring. The Summative ELPAC measures how much progress your child is making in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. Your child's voice will be recorded during the speaking part of the test. These recording may be used to double check test scores and will not be saved or made public. This test will give your child's teacher information about where your child may need extra support.

Your child will take the Summative ELPAC every spring until they are fluent in English and no longer need support to understand and learn in English. The testing schedule is listed below:

This year, Conejo Valley Unified School District will give the Summative ELPAC in person, remotely, or through a combination of in-person and remote.

You are an important part of your child's education. To make sure your child feels comfortable taking the test, you can:

- Explain to your child that the test is a tool to help them learn and to not be anxious or scared.
- · Remind your child that you and their teacher want them to try their very best.
- Explore a practice test with your child at <u>alpac org/resources/online-practice-and-training-test/</u> so they are familiar with the platform and setup.
- Talk with your child's teacher about their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills to help support their learning.

You will receive your child's results at or before the beginning of the next school year. The results will identify where your child is doing well or needs more help, so you can better support their learning at home and teachers can better support their learning in the classroom.

- Our goal is to complete the Summative ELPAC by mid-March.




One-on-One and Group Testing Scenarios

One-on-One Testing Scenario






Secure Browser Computer

Group Testing Scenario





Reclassification

California Department of Education RFEP Criteria

Reclassification is the process whereby a student is **reclassified** from an **English learner** to Fluent **English Proficient** (RFEP). Local districts determine when the student has met the 4 criteria listed in Education Code (EC) Section 313 (f), in accordance with the **California** Department of Education (CDE).

- 1. Assessment of language proficiency using an objective assessment instrument, including, but not limited to, the English language development test (ELPAC: Level 4) that is developed or acquired pursuant to Section 60810.
- 2. Comparison of the performance of the pupil in **basic skills against an empirically established range of performance** in basic skills based upon the performance of English proficient pupils of the same age, that demonstrates whether the pupil is sufficiently proficient in English to participate effectively in a curriculum designed for pupils of the same age whose native language is English.
- **3.** Teacher evaluation, including, but not limited to, a review of the pupil's curriculum mastery.
- 4. Parental opinion and consultation.

Reclassification Chart for 2021-2022 School Year

Reclassification is the process that determines whether an English Learner (EL) should be reclassified as Fluent English Proficient (RFEP). Reclassification relies on evidence demonstrating that the student has achieved a level of English proficiency comparable to that of average native speakers of English in the district and is achieving and sustaining a basic level of academic achievement with students whose native language is English.

District reclassification policies and procedures are aligned with California Department of Education guidelines. Multiple criteria are utilized to establish that the student is ready to be reclassified. Initial ELPAC candidates will be Initially Fluent English Proficient (IFEP) if they meet IFEP criteria.

2021-22 RFEP Candidates in CVUSD

- In CVUSD, we reclassify twice a year.
 - The first time is after Trimester 1 (November) and the second time is after Trimester 2 (March).
- 165 students have been reclassified so far this school year!
 - Grade 2: 16 students
 - Grades 3-5: 47 students
 - Grades 6-8: 41 students
 - Grades 9-12: 36 students
- We are in the middle of processing 14 more students for reclassification. This will give us a total of 179 Reclassified students after Trimester 1.
- After Trimester 2, we will check new students' scores to see if we have more RFEP Candidates.
