Definitions

Foster Youth

• An individual under the age of 18 that has been removed from their home as the result of child welfare concerns, emergency circumstances related to custody, out-of-home probation, or voluntary placement agreement

CVUSD FORWARD

McKinney-Vento Youth

- Students who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence
- Doubled-Up
- Living in hotels/motels
- Living in transitional shelters
- Living in a public or private place not designed for or regularly used as sleeping accommodations (unsheltered)
- Unaccompanied youth who are not in the physical custody of a parent/guardian

Identification Process

- Foster Youth
 - Resource Families identified by the County provide evidence of student's current Foster status and placement at the time of enrollment
 - Student Support Services is alerted and identifies the Educational Rights holder
 - Foster program status remains unless/until the student has a legal guardian appointed, is legally adopted, or turns 21
- McKinney-Vento Youth
 - A student Residency Questionnaire (SRQ) is embedded within the online Pre-Enroll process, is included in the paper enrollment packets, and is a part of Annual Updates
 - If any of the qualifiers are met through the SRQ, Student Support Services is immediately alerted
 - McKinney-Vento status can change at any point in the school year, and resets at the end of each year, which is why the information must be captured annually

Rights of Foster and McKinney-Vento Youth

- Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 6173, 6173.1
 - Right to immediate enrollment in school, even if records are incomplete
 - Right to remain in school of origin when a move takes place, if it is in the student's best interest
 - School of origin can be the last school attended, or the school attended when permanently housed
 - If homeless status changes midyear, right to remain in their current school through the completion of the school year
 - Right to matriculate to the next school in the attendance area



Additional Rights of Foster and McKinney-Vento Youth

- Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 6173, 6173.1
 - Access to the same educational resources and opportunities as all others
 - Opportunity to meet the same challenging state academic standards established for all students
 - Receive partial credit for work completed at other schools, when a school change is made during a semester
 - Right to reduced graduation requirements through Assembly Bills 167/216



Outreach and Ongoing Communication

- Upon learning of a Foster or McKinney-Vento student enrolling, Student Support Services staff reaches out directly to the family to establish a positive, supportive relationship and to determine if the student or family has any immediate needs
- Families are also directly connected to the school site Foster/McKinney-Vento Liaison, who reaches out every two weeks thereafter to check on attendance, academics, well-being and needs
- The Conejo Closet Needs Assessment Form is shared and assists us in providing clothing, shoes, toiletries and school supplies to students and their families

Items are delivered to the student's school, or directly to the home if preferred

Explicit Supports

- Conejo Closet
 - 172 Foster and McKinney-Vento students have accessed the Conejo Closet this year
- Wifi/Hotspots
- Transportation for McKinney-Vento students
- Direct connection to community partners
 - Harbor House
 - Adelante Comunidad
 - Safe Passage
 - Food Share
 - Conejo Free Clinic
 - Westminster Free Clinic



Additional Supports

- Early-Back Intervention
 - Held in August before the start of the new school year
 - Half-day program offered at three school campuses
 - Transportation included
 - Taught by CVUSD teachers with the support of bilingual and special education paraeducators
- Approximately 205 Foster and McKinney-Vento students are currently accessing site-based interventions
- Welcome Back School Supply Event
- Holiday Toy Distribution Event
- Spring Prom Dress Event
