



INTRODUCTION

Hi! I'm Megan Goebel and my pronouns are she | her. My husband Kelly (he | him) is a CVUSD alumni, and we have two daughters attending Wildwood Elementary.

My oldest, Hayden is 11 and in 5th grade. My youngest Harper is 7 and in 2nd grade.

Harper is transgender.

She socially transitioned the summer before starting Kindergarten, which prompted me to start asking all kinds of questions, and is where I began my deep dive into advocating for LGBTQ+ youth.

During Covid, I started a community based organization called Unity Conejo which introduced me to many other LGBTQ+ students and families, and that helped define the broader needs and challenges these individuals face.

WHAT IS THE LGBTQ + AC?

LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER OR QUESTIONING, AND OTHERS ADVISORY COUNCIL

The purpose of the LGBTQ+ Advisory Council is to build productive partnerships between CVUSD staff and families by including parent/guardian and community voices and perspectives when addressing the needs of LGBTQ+ students and families.

Additionally, the LGBTQ+ AC advises CVUSD on strategies to assist us in becoming more welcoming and inclusive of our LGBTQ+ students, and to further support our LGBTQ+ students by being affirming and inclusive in our actions.

WHY DO WE NEED AN LGBTQ + AC?

Overall, 10.3% of California's students in public middle and high schools identified as LGBTQ.

- In rural areas, 10.0% of students surveyed identified as LGBTQ.
- In urban areas, 10.5% of students surveyed identified as LGBTQ.

Across the state, LGBTQ youth reported having less meaningful school participation, lower expectations from adults, fewer caring adult relationships at school, and a lower level of school connection than non-LGBTQ youth.

LGBTQ youth in California reported less connection with school and more frequent victimization than their non-LGBTQ peers.

LGBTQ youth in California reported a more negative school environment than non-LGBTQ youth.

Only 1 in 3 LGBTQ youth found their home to be LGBTQ-affirming.

SUCCESSES IN OUR FIRST 6 MEETINGS

- Representatives from 19 of 26 school sites
- Nominated and elected our Chairperson, Vice Chair, Secretary and Parliamentarian
- Created and distributed opt-in information to all sites within our first 3 months
- Drafted By Laws, Standing Rules
- Reviewed newly authored School Success Plan
- Reviewed the California Healthy Kids Survey which helped further our scope and discussion on how to better support our LGBTQ+ students
- Previewed the District-wide Gender Diversity training currently being offered by Dr. Lisa Miller, Mr. Kenny Loo, and CVUSD Directors. The Advisory Council engaged on updating some of the language live.
- Began forming subcommittees to identify and take on specific needs at the elementary and secondary levels.
- We worked with Student Support Services to create an LGBTQ+ landing page within the CVUSD website.
- 4 of our Advisory Council members participate in the District's LGBTQ+ Working Group and have partnered with Dr. Dena Sellers to identify LGBTQ+ titles that could be adopted into our CVUSD libraries in the near future.
