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


Mental Health and Wellness Growth

- Sustainability-Comprehensive Youth Behavioral Health Initiative



Moving Toward Sustainability

Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI)

Managed by the California Health and Human Services Agency

Goal is to integrate service delivery capitalizing on meeting children where they are **\$4 billion State initiative to improve health care systems for children, teens and their families**

Barriers are removed by using schools and college campuses as service delivery locations

CYBHI and Current Billing System Comparison

CYBHI

- Covers all students
- Medi-Cal and private plan reimbursement
- Reimbursement through single entity
- Capacity grant to build infrastructure that is compatible with Q

Current Medi-Cal

- Covers students with disabilities
 with services on IEPs
- Medi-Cal reimbursement only
- Reimbursement delays
- Districts leave monies on the table due to reimbursement delays

Public awareness to reduce stigma and raise awareness around emotional, mental and behavioral health



(2YBH and (2VUS))

- School districts will be eligible to bill Medi-Cal and private insurance for services delivered on school campuses.
- VCOE-\$7.5 million for infrastructure including: integrating systems, billing, privacy protections and documentation
- The state statute (W&I Code section 5961.4) requires commercial health plans and the Medi-Cal delivery system, as applicable, to reimburse, at or above the published rates, these school-linked providers, regardless of network provider status, for services furnished to students pursuant to the fee schedule. Further, services provided as part of the fee schedule shall not be subject to copayment, coinsurance, deductible, or any other form of cost sharing.
