
- Be a California high school graduate

# Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS)

Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS), is a state funded program designed to encourage the enrollment, retention, and the transfer of students challenged by language, social, economic (federal poverty guidelines), and educational disadvantages, and to facilitate the successful completion of their goals and objectives in college.

#### To be eligible, a student must:

- Be a resident of California or <u>AB540 (Dream Act)</u>
- Be enrolled as a full-time student (12+ units)
  - Note: Foster Youth (9+ units)-ACCESS students (6+ units with a verification letter)
- Have less than 50 degree applicable units
- Qualify to receive a California College Promise Grant A or B or C (with \$0 EFC) and (apply at <u>CCCAPPLY</u>)
- $\cdot$  Be educationally disadvantaged as defined by EOPS

#### **Educationally Disadvantaged**

- **EOPS** defines educational disadvantages as:
- $\cdot$  Do not have high school diploma, GED or H.S. proficiency
- High school GPA below 2.5 (submit high school transcript)
- Previously enrolled in remedial education (High school or College)

### To be APPROVED for EOPS


- 1. Meet State eligibility requirements
- 2. Complete an EOPS Application
- 3. Submit and turn in "ALL" necessary documents
- 4. Print Schedule Bill from Portal
- 5. Transcripts (high school and college, if applicable)
- 6. Verification from ACCESS for less than 12 units
- 7. Attend Mandatory Orientation



### Transfer Admission Guarantees (TAGs) with

### 6 UC's: UC DAVIS, UC IRVINE, UC MERCED, UC RIVERSIDE, UCSB, UC SANTA CRUZ

Students participating in TAG, will receive early review of their academic records, receive early admission notification and specific guidance about major preparation and general education coursework.

Keep in mind: TAG applications are due Sept. 30, but students can only apply for a TAG at one campus. To keep your options open, apply to other UC campuses during the regular application cycle (Nov. 1-30). Students are also able to use the <u>UC Transfer Admission Planner</u> to track their progress in meeting UC's minimum requirements.

## **Entrance Requirements:**

1.Submit an application electronically. <u>To</u> <u>apply electronically, click here</u>
2.Submit your transcript(s) to Admissions and Records. High school GPA of 3.25 (unweighted) **OR**

- 1. College G.P.A. of 3.00 with 12 units of transferable college-level courses.
- 2. Attendance at mandatory Honors orientation.

3.Attend mandatory Honors Orientation: The times and days of the orientations can be found in the provisional acceptance letter that will be emailed to you upon review of your transcript or by emailing Nathan Bowen at <u>nbowen@vcccd.edu</u>.

# DUAL ENROLLMENT

# What is General Population Dual Enrollment?

K-12 students who choose to take a Moorpark College course offered on the college campus are considered General Population Dual Enrollment students. They find a course that they are interested in taking in our <u>Schedule of</u> <u>Classes</u>, discuss it with their high school counselor, and follow the enrollment steps to

register. The students will be in the course of their choice alongside other Moorpark College

students.



### What is the Dual Enrollment Program?

Our Dual Enrollment department works with the local high school districts and staff to decide on Moorpark College courses to offer *at the high school,* specifically for that high school's students. So instead of having K-12 students travel to the college to take a course, we bring the college courses to the high school. This means that we must have a minimum of 30 students interested to be able to offer one of these courses. They are filled with only high school students, meaning your classmates will be your high school peers. We do not publish our courses online in the Schedule of Classes because they are reserved for our program's students only. The high school campus informs the students of the courses that will be offered at their high school each semester.

> The Moorpark College Dual Enrollment Program currently partners with following school districts to offer our courses through their high school campuses: Conejo Valley Unified School District Las Virgenes Unified School District Moorpark Unified School District Simi Valley Unified School District Oak Park Unified School District California Youth Authority
