

Committee Timing and Scope

- $\circ~$ The committee was created in December 2021.
- The committee was formed to find and build resources for schools to use in disability-focused events in lieu of using disability simulations.
- As the committee did its work, we began to expand our vision and goals for what we wanted to accomplish.
- We decided to create a comprehensive toolkit that could shift hearts and minds and build skills for inclusion.



SEDAC Committee Actions

- ✓ Held 8 meetings total since December.
- ✓ At our initial meeting on December 6, we discussed the vision for the committee and brainstormed ideas. We decided to prioritize creating a resource toolkit and addressing the issue of disability simulations as part of Abilities Awareness events.
- ✓ We identified the four main disability celebration events and assigned committee members to research each one.
- ✓ We created a survey to gather ideas from SEDAC members that was sent out in February.
- ✓ We created a document that describes <u>Disability Simulations</u> and the reasons we no longer use them, which was presented and distributed to SEDAC members in March.
- ✓ We focused on creating the Disability Celebrations Toolkit, which was presented to the SEDAC Executive Board and the CVUSD Cabinet for feedback last week.
- $\checkmark\,$ We are presenting the completed Toolkit to SEDAC today.





Committee Recommendations Beyond the Toolkit

- Recommend that the district provide training to principals on the Toolkit, perspectives of people with disabilities and teaching students about inclusion.
- Recommend a potential resource for this training: Diana Pastora Carson was a teacher who developed the Beyond Awareness Program to move instruction about disability beyond awareness to inclusion.
- Recommend that the district sponsor an annual speaker with disabilities to deliver a virtual presentation that any school can access for events.
- Recommend that students be eligible for the annual recognition of Inclusion Heroes.
- Recommend that the district add additional titles to the Core Literature list with stories that focus on disabled characters.
