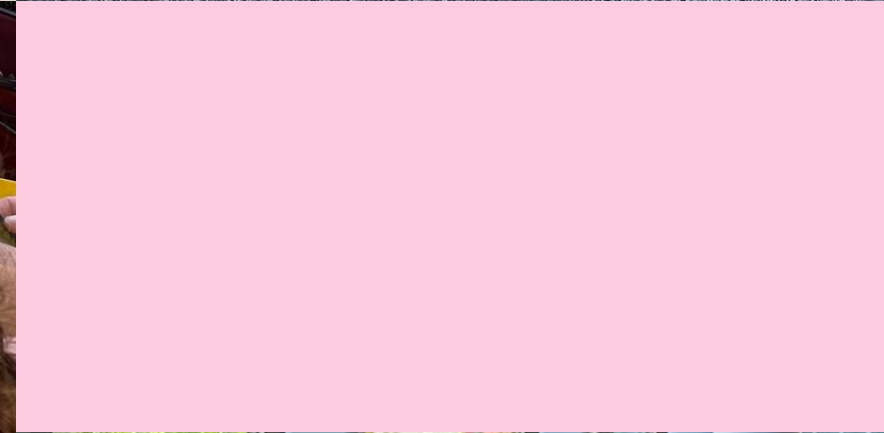

Grant R. Brimhall Library



The Thousand Oaks Library opened in its present location at 1401 East Janss Road, in 1982. In 1998, following the retirement of longtime City Manager and library supporter Grant R. Brimhall, the building was renamed the Grant R. Brimhall Library.

In 2006, the 62,000 square foot facility was expanded by 22,000 square feet with completion of the Children's Library. Unique amenities at this location include a 3,600-gallon salt-water aquarium donated by the Friends of the Thousand Oaks Library.

Newbury Park Library



The Newbury Park Library at 2331 Borchard Road in Newbury Park was opened to the public in 1991. This 21,000 square foot facility services the western parts of the city.

The Hold Lockers at Newbury Park Library opened in 2020 to serve the community 24/7.

Volunteers work with students to help them improve their reading confidence and enjoyment.

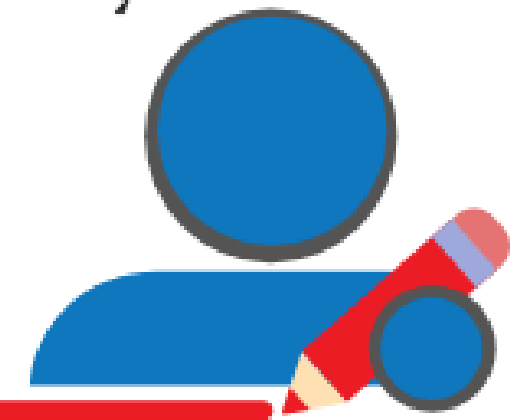
Writing Buddies

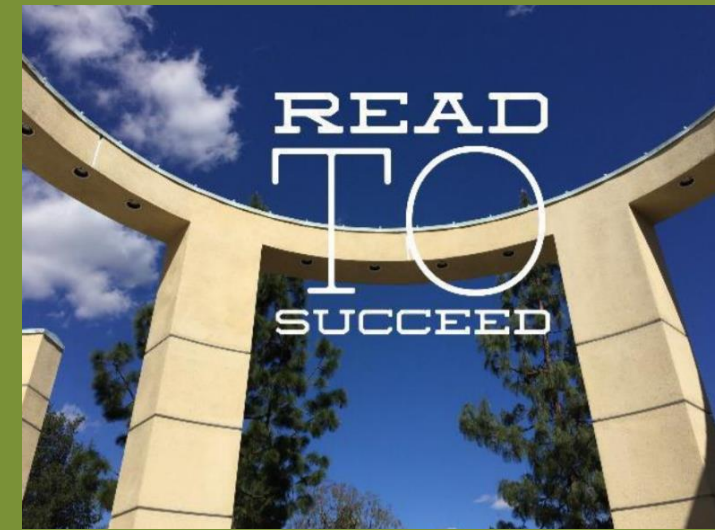
