

What is it?

You must...

The Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO-P) provides funding for afterschool and summer school enrichment programs for transitional kindergarten through sixth grade.


When is it offered?

"Expanded learning" means before school, after school, summer, or intersession learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of pupils through hands-on, engaging learning experiences.

ELO-P Funding Guidelines



- Unduplicated funding formula - \$1,170 - \$2,500 per pupil
- Need to offer to at least all unduplicated students (EL, Foster, & SED)
- Required to serve at least 50% of unduplicated students in the 2021-22 year
- In 2022-23- will be required to offer the program to <u>ALL</u> students TK-6 and <u>required</u> to serve if family requests

ELO-P Program Elements

- 1. Educational and literacy element in which tutoring or homework assistance is provided in one or more of the following ways:
 - Language arts
 - Math
 - History/social science
 - Computer training
 - Science
- 2. Educational Enrichment
 - Fine Arts
 - Career Technical Education
 - Recreation, Physical Fitness, and Prevention Activities
- 3. Encouraged to collaborate with community based organizations

2021-2022- Implementation Year

- Develop a program plan
- Review plan every 3 years (goals, content, and outcome measures)

Maintain ASES program	Working on partnering with YMCA - Find My Genius Curriculum	1 Certificated Employee (hourly pay) and 1 Academic Specialist (\$20/hr) paid to run ELOP after school program. Can be shared among teachers with designated schedules.
Ensure no students are turned away	Programs run on site after inviting all unduplicated students and accepting other students that will commit to the program.	Programs will include offerings from CRPD, enriching assemblies and experiences, learning platforms (IXL, Lexia, Smarty Ants, Imagine Learning, etc.), and homework assistance.
Summer 2022 - Students from Title I Schools that are being recommended for Summer Learning Camp will be invited to attend SLC at Glenwood and then be able to access Star for ELO-P from 12:00-5:30 PM each day at Glenwood.
