#### **Ethnic Studies Model Curriculum Overview**

- Four Foundational Disciplines:
  - 1. African American
  - 2. Chicana/o/X and Latina/o/X
  - 3. Native American
  - 4. Asian American and Pacific Islander
- Affords local educational agencies the flexibility to adapt the curriculum to address the demographics and diversity of the classroom.
- The adaptations should center on deepening or augmenting, rather than scaling down any of the four disciplines
- Educators can create and utilize lessons rooted in the four foundational disciplines alongside the sample key themes of (1) Identity, (2) History and Movement, (3) Systems of Power, and (4) Social Movements and Equity

# **Eight Outcomes of Ethnic Studies Teaching**

- 1. Pursuit of justice and equity
- 2. Working toward greater inclusivity
- 3. Furthering self-understanding
- 4. Developing a better understanding of others
- 5. Recognizing intersectionality
- 6. Promoting self-empowerment for civic engagement
- 7. Supporting a community focus
- 8. Developing interpersonal communication
