- The meeting emphasized the importance of community resources for students with additional needs.
- Alexandra Buenrostro Rangel, one of the Counselors for the Breakthrough Student Assistance Program talked about the Conejo Closet and other community resources, in particular how the school district partners with these organisations.
 - Breakthrough is a program that provides safe, welcoming solutions for students and families, often referred by other school counselors or teachers.
 - Alex explained BRIM (Brief Risk Intervention Method) used to assess the needs of students and connect them with the Conejo Closet and other community partners like Adelante, the Assistance League, and the Westminster Clinic to supporting students beyond what the Conejo Closet can provide.
 - Conejo Closet serves around 800 families or students annually, it
 is a comprehensive resource for students, providing essential
 items like clothes, school supplies, toiletries, and more.
 Reach out to Amber Bowman to learn more about volunteer
 opportunities and donation needs for the Conejo Closet.
 - Community partnerships with the school district are vital to address broader issues such as electricity and food insecurity.
 - Students and families can be referred to Breakthrough and the Conejo Closet through various channels, including school counselors, teachers, and students themselves.
 - Breakthrough sits down with the admin team and counselors at the beginning of the year to go over community resources and answer any questions.
