 - i. District Advisory Council (DAC)
 - Here are the key takeaways from the last Super DAC meeting.
 - It was a SuperDAC meeting, and high school counselors presented concerns about and alternatives to the current valedictorian recognition system. Members discussed in small groups and shared questions and concerns.
 - A fun and informative update on the LCAP was provided, with an additional survey for all student/district advisory council and committee members to follow.
 - During the general portion of the meeting, DAC members approved the DAC Nominating Committee for the 2025-26 DAC Executive Board.
 - All student and parent advisory councils and committees shared important updates, including topics of discussion, committees, and an "ask" or request for other members in attendance.
 - Some of the requests from Advisory Council and Committees included support for students and families going through difficult times due to the current immigration policies; get involved in the school community; support for GATE differentiation strategies; recruitment for current vacancies on LGBTQ+AC and its subcommittees; and presume competency and include our students with IEPs.

- v. LGBTQ+ District Advisory Council
 - In light of the recent executive order, LGBGQ+ parents, students and allies are scared. The meeting began with words from all attendees and hearing the personal stories from members of this community painted a very bleak picture.
 - Visibility and support are paramount in this moment, from principals to educators to all support staff to make sure these students feel safe and protected.
 - It was noted that CA law currently supersedes all executive orders at the federal level meaning all LGBTQ+ students and faculty are protected and freedom of expression remains the rule of law.
 - Further, bullying and harassment of LGBTQ+ students and faculty is still reportable and punishable behavior. An inclusive environment is still expected to be adhered to in all CA public schools.
 - The lack of GSAs or equivalent clubs, particularly at the HS level is of concern and, as discussed, I am reaching out to your faculty liaison to consider plans going forward (as well as plans for June's Pride Month and school-wide inclusive activities).
