








Enrollment in TK and K

- Beginning, January 27, 2025, visit the CVUSD website at https://conejo.vcoe.org/preenrollment/ and follow the instructions on pre-enrollment.
- You will complete the pre-enrollment process online and save, then email the final page to the office manager at your neighborhood school. They will provide further instructions to complete the enrollment process. Paper enrollment packets will also be available at all school sites and at the District Office, in the Student Support Services Department.
- Enrollment begins at your neighborhood school for TK and K, even if you apply for school choice. For the 25-26 school year all schools, except EARThS Magnet have TK classes.

Immunizations

According to California Legislation:

- California schools are required to check immunization records for all new student admissions at TK/Kindergarten. Parents must show their child's Immunization Record as proof of immunization.

TK and K Enrollment Information

- Enrollment for TK and K for the 25-26 school year will begin at your neighborhood school site.
- Final decisions on how many TK and K classes will be at each site and will be made in the Spring based on enrollment.

TK and K Age Requirements

- Transitional Kindergarten Turning 5 between 9/02/2025 through 9/1/2026, *Education Code (EC) Section 48000.*
- Kindergarten Must turn 5 by 9/01/2025. Students that turn 5 on 9/02/2025 will enroll in TK.
- For students with birthdates of July 1, 2020-September 1, 2020, families can choose whether to enroll their student in TK or K for the 2025-26 school year, *CVUSD Board Policy* 6170.1.



The first years of schooling are critical ones. In transitional kindergarten through grade one, children acquire the skills, knowledge, and dispositions that establish the foundation for a lifetime of learning. Children achieve these skills and understandings through carefully specified and strategically sequenced instruction and rich, authentic experiences in a developmentally appropriate environment.

A Day in TK

- Self-directed play opportunities
- Uninterrupted choice time
- Outdoor times including recess and lunch
- Exposure to letters, sounds and numbers
- Purposeful play
- Direct instruction in academic topics
- 1:12 ratio with a full time an aide in every class

- Developmentally appropriate learning
- Oral language and literacy development

Special Education

Students with a disability are provided direct services to support their unique learning needs.

Each elementary school site has a special education teacher.

If a child's disability requires a higher level of services, CVUSD does offer specialized programs for TK and K age students.

School Choice

All of Conejo Valley Unified Schools are considered Schools of Choice. As long as a school is not filled to its capacity with existing students and incoming neighborhood students, students living outside the neighborhood boundaries of a school may apply to enroll in that school.

*TK students accepted on School Choice will stay at that school for K-5. To return to your neighborhood school you would need to school choice back.




